

**NOTIFICATION**

**SUMMER COURSE AND SUMMER EXAMINATION AUGUST – 2010**

Our Institution was granted 'Autonomy' by VTU, Belgaum from the academic year 2007-08. In the autonomous scheme the evaluation is done in two parts. Equal weight-age is given for both the parts. First part is Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) and the second part is the end term known as semester End Examination (SEE).

The CIE is spread through out the semester, consisting of two tests, a mid term exam, quiz or surprise test and assignments. The details of distribution of marks as in the regulation book supplied to all the students.

The total marks for each subject is usually 100. (CIE marks 50 and SEE marks 50). It is mandatory that the candidate has to score at least 40% marks (20 out of 50) in CIE to become eligible to take up the end term examination (SEE) apart from satisfying minimum attendance requirement. And the candidate has to score at least 40% of marks (20 out of 50) in the end term (SEE) to get a pass in the subject. Thus the candidate who passes the subject will be getting a minimum of 40% of marks (i.e, 40 out of 100). Absolute grading is done in each subject depending upon the marks the candidate has secured. The details can be had from the regulation book.

The criterion for vertical progression i.e, moving to next academic year for any candidate is he/she can carry only 3 'F' (Subjects Fail) to the next academic year. (Odd to even semester is total mobility)

To facilitate candidates who are deprived of moving to next academic year due to the above criteria, the summer course is introduced. However, candidates who have failed in more subjects may also register for the courses. Never the less, the total no. of credits/subjects that may be registered for summer course is limited to 3 theories and one lab or one non credited (audit) course. (Even after this exercise, if a student has 3 'F's, he cannot have vertical progression)

The summer course is arranged during the vacation period between even and odd semesters (July-01 to Aug-30). The total no. of working days would be half the full semester. In this context, to facilitate completion of syllabus the number of contact hours per week is doubled for summer course (compared to the normal semester). Similarly the schedule of examination will also have to be squeezed to 3 days only (instead of 6 days as in the normal semester).

It may be notified the number of subjects from I to VI semester is quite large. The candidates who have failed in different semesters also would like to register in the summer semester. It is practically impossible to have a time table which can accommodate all the registered subjects in multiple semesters. Thus a comprehensive time table stretching the number of days to six (instead of 3) is made to accommodate all subjects.

Such of the candidates wanting to register for more than one subject will have to look in to summer examination time table. Candidates may register for subjects in the summer course only if the subject does not clash in the examination time table.

However, in case of clash, candidates are informed to fill the form available with the Registrar's (Evaluation) office before June 30<sup>th</sup>. Filling the form will not guarantee the accommodation of the Subject (in clash) in the time table. However, the forms thus received will be examined and decision will be taken.

Please note that the subject clash only with one subject is allowed. Clash with two or more subjects will not be considered.
